

What an unusual winter we are having! Usually the snow and the cold forces me into the basement where I can work on my projects without guilt, but the sun and warm(er) weather has led me to focus on other projects. However, as I type this the snow is coming down so perhaps things are getting back to normal.

Speaking of normal, during the pandemic I had several "Covid projects". I am sure many of you did as well. One of them was a new layout project: a Japanese-themed T-Trak module. While HO is my primary scale, the chance to do some *very different* modeling in N scale seemed like a great idea. One downside though was that many of the structures and details I needed had to come from Japan, and the pandemic slowed all international shipping.

Randomly and months later the items I ordered would arrive and I would work on my project. It was slowly coming along but I had no real motivation to push through with it. Until recently, that is, when I offered to include it with the local T-Trak club at an upcoming train show. With only two months to go, I had to make some significant progress. Despite being only 14" x 36", it includes a bustling city scene and an adjacent forest

complete with historic inn at the top of a winding trail.

I had left off working on a farmer's market and festival scene. This involved cutting out, painting, gluing, and posing lots of really tiny bits of styrene into fruit stands, ramen carts, tables, and the like. It was a lot of fun to work on but it really took up time. And time wasn't something I had a lot of. When completed, it barely covered a space about the size of a mailing envelope!

Trees were another challenge, because I didn't want to make my own. I found a commercial brand that looked pretty good and were durable and I ordered 60, but they too didn't cover a lot of ground (no pun intended). Nor did the sixty figures I had purchased. In N scale, you can create large scenes but small details just seem disappear. I can now appreciate the efforts of N scale modelers, including many in our Division with really excellent layouts.

I realized my module won't be finished by the train show, but I'm okay with that. It is presentable as is, and over the next few months I can continue to chip away at it when I am not working on other models. After all, this is just a hobby. It is easy to see people with gorgeous, finished layouts and get

discouraged because your own efforts are not as complete or of the same quality. But it is a journey. I am constantly learning new techniques and frequently go back to make changes as my skills improve. That is what makes this hobby great. So if you have any

My favorite part of the hobby is building structures. There are several kitbashed craftsman kits, and scratch-built structures installed or to be installed on the layout. Doug Dederick, Kevin Surman and Artie Krass spent several evenings helping me set up the layout for operation. The first step was to remove about half of the buildings because there was no room for tracks.

If you were at my last open house in 2019, I've made these changes since then:

- 1. Added a staging yard.
- 2. Added scenery in various places.
- 3. Set the layout up for car card operations.
- 4. Did a lot of work in the city of Port. I think it was just foam then.
- 5. I added new track in several locations.
- 6. I added lighting to a lot of buildings.
- 7. Most likely, things I can't think of right now.
- 8. And yes, I added some new buildings.

It is probably safe to say the majority of us modelers are collectors in some form. Ives and Lionel trains are the grandfather of collecting trains.


I model in N scale and it has become one of the most collected of all scales. It's small size and clear plastic packaging lends itself well to display and safekeeping. It has the N Scale Enthusiast organization to share and support this activity along with www.trovestar.com, a database with over 100,000 N scale items identified.

Recently VW Doug, a capital region buyer and seller of all things N-scale, handed me a four car blister-pack of Intermountain R-40-23 reefers and inquired if I had ever seen this item or had any knowledge about it. The set is a four pack of special run Alfred Packer Meat Company "Specialty Meats". They are decorated with Alfred's likeness and different slogans: "Have A Friend For Dinner" and "Serving His Fellow Man." After looking it over and shaking my head, Doug instructed me to flip it over and read the back.

Holy Cow! Alfred Packer was one of the more notorious characters from the Colorado gold rush days and had apparently survived a harsh winter in the mountains by cannibalizing his group of prospectors. You can read the macabre "blow by blow" accounting of this episode on Wikipedia.

I set to "digging" for more information on this collector set and found it was commissioned by Caboose Hobbies in Denver, Colorado in 1996. Three hundred four-car sets were produced by Intermountain and were sold only through Caboose Hobbies for \$74.95.
