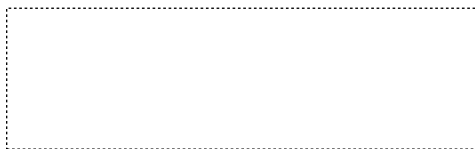
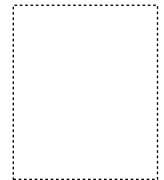


At the end of August, Amtrak announced that the “Great Dome Car” would be retired from the operational fleet and stored at the Beech Grove shops.

The car was tacked on the rear of the Adirondack between Albany and Montreal for patrons to enjoy the fall foliage since 2007. Several Division members acted as guides along the route over the years, pointing out areas of historical importance along the route.
